To: All Vessel Managers, Deputy Registrars, Surveyors and other Interested Parties

Subject: STCW Manila Amendments coming into effect from 1 January 2012

Date: 14 December 2011

Summary:

The following information is provided to ensure Cook Islands vessel managers, owners, Masters and crew are aware of the Manila Amendments coming into effect on 1 January 2012.

In accordance with STCW 95, as amended Chapter VIII/1, attention is to be given to the danger posed by fatigue of seafarers, especially those whose duties involve the safe and secure operation of a ship.

All persons who are assigned duty as officer in charge of watch or as a rating forming part of a watch, and those whose duties involve designated safety, prevention of pollution and security duties shall be provided with a rest period of not less than:

- (i) A minimum of 10 hour of rest in any 24 hour period; and
- (ii) 77 hours in any 7 day period

The hours of rest may be divided into no more than two periods, one of which shall be no less than 6 hours in length, and the intervals between consecutive periods of rest shall not exceed 14 hours. In cases of emergency, and necessity these requirements may be exempted.

Ship-owners/Masters must ensure that watch schedules are easily accessible by all crew and established in the standardised format set out by MO/ILO Guidelines. The tables must be completed in English and the working language of the ship.

Seafarers shall receive a copy of the record of their work / rest hours, which shall be endorsed by the Master or other person authorised by the Master, and by the seafarer.
